

ARTE LATINO: *Treasures from the Smithsonian American Art Museum* highlights more than 200 years of Latino art from the United States and Puerto Rico. The paintings, sculptures, and photographs in the exhibition represent many different cultural traditions developed by mostly Spanish-speaking artists who settled in America. Whether U.S.-born or immigrant, whether Puerto Rican, Mexican American, Chicano, Cuban American, or from countries in Central or South America, the artists present human stories that are at once culturally specific and universal. They explore personal identity by examining the legacy of their past.

Powerful, provocative, contemplative, and proud, the works in this exhibition honor people and explore place. They attest to the uniqueness of the individual and of the rich and varied experience of being Latino in the United States.

Arte Latino is one of eight exhibitions in Treasures to Go from the Smithsonian American Art Museum, touring the nation through 2002. The Principal Financial Group® is a proud partner in bringing these treasures to the American people.



ARTE LATINO: *Tesoros del Museo de Arte Americano de la Smithsonian Institution* representa más de 200 años de arte latino de los Estados Unidos y Puerto Rico. Las pinturas, esculturas y fotografías que se exhiben son muestras representativas de numerosas tradiciones culturales creadas, en su mayor parte, por artistas de habla hispana establecidos en Estados Unidos. Bien se trate de artistas nativos de Estados Unidos o de inmigrantes, de puertorriqueños, chicanos, americanos de origen mexicano, cubano, centroamericano o sudamericano, las historias que presentan son, al mismo tiempo, culturalmente específicas y universales. Exploran la identidad personal a través del legado de su pasado.
